How to get here

Villa Ceselle is located in the peaceful little town of Anacapri, in the highest part of the island of Capri. Anacapri is linked to the port of Marina Grande either by direct bus or by bus with connection in the center of Capri.

How our shuttle service operates

Don't worry about how to get to Anacapri and Villa Ceselle: on your arrival, we'll come and collect you from the port and accompany you to the hotel. We'll also provide the return service on the day of your departure. All you need to do is give us a call to let us know which ferry or hydrofoil you'll be arriving on. This said, below you'll find detailed information of how to reach us, which will, no doubt, be of use to you during your stay.

How to get to Anacapri

The direct bus from Marina Grande to Anacapri departs approximately every hour, meaning that often you'll be better off taking the funicular railway train which departs every fifteen minutes from the port and which, in just three minutes, transports passengers to the center of Capri. From here, it is only a few meters to the bus station, from where buses depart for Anacapri approximately every 15 minutes.

How to get to Villa Ceselle

Guests traveling to Anacapri by bus should descend at the "Bar Grotta Azzurra" bus stop. It's the 4th stop after "Piazza Vittoria", the main bus stop in Anacapri (usually announced by the driver, who simply calls out "Anacapri"). Feel free to ask the driver to let you know when the bus gets to the Bar Grotta Azzurra stop. From here, you'll need to walk down Via Pagliaro for about 200 meters until reaching a junction. Turn left and walk uphill for circa 50 meters.

How to get to the Island of Capri

The island of Capri can be reached by hydrofoil or ferry from the ports of Naples and Sorrento. Ferries are slower and less frequent than hydrofoils. They are also cheaper (ferry tickets cost circa 13.00 Euro whilst hydrofoil tickets cost circa 17.00 Euro). In the months of June, July and August, boat crossings are also available from Positano, Amalfi and Ischia.

In peak season, in the months of July and August, to be sure of getting a seat, we advise you to arrive at the port ahead of time.

For the latest departure times, consult the website: www.capri.net.

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Bear in mind that the times of sea crossings vary considerably from low to high season and that, in the case of adverse weather conditions, hydrofoil services are often suspended. Ferry crossings are only very rarely cancelled.

From Sorrento to Capri

In Sorrento, hydrofoils and ferries to Capri depart from the port of Marina Piccola. The port is easily reached on foot via a series of steps which commence in Piazza Tasso, Sorrento's main square. If you have heavy items of luggage, we suggest you take a bus or taxi. Sorrento is linked to the city of Naples and the majority of the towns in the province by the Circumvesuviana railway line.

The boat journey takes approximately 20 minutes by hydrofoil and 30 minutes by ferry.

From Naples to Capri

In Naples, boats to Capri depart from the ports of Molo Beverello (hydrofoils) and Calata di Massa (ferries). A free shuttle bus links the two ports, which are circa 500 meters apart.

From Naples' Piazza Garibaldi railway station to Molo Beverello

Although public transport is available, given that buses and trams are usually extremely crowded and that there are no clear indications of when and where to get off, in Naples we suggest you travel by taxi.

Do not accept offers of rides from anybody who approaches you in the station, instead make straight for the line of licensed taxi cabs immediately outside. We suggest you ask the driver to apply the fixed rate to the port (circa 10.00 Euro), before entering the car. Depending on the traffic, the journey should take about ten minutes.

From Naples' Capodichino airport to Molo Beverello

BUS – Just outside Terminal 1 you'll find the "Alibus", which takes passengers to the center of Naples. Tickets cost circa 3.00 Euro and can be purchased directly on board. The journey takes approximately 40 minutes. The bus stops in Piazza Municipio, about 3 minutes away from Molo Beverello.

TAXI – Licensed taxi cabs wait outside Terminal 1. Do not accept offers of rides from anybody approaching you inside the terminal building. We suggest you ask your taxi driver to apply the fixed rate to the port (circa 20.00 Euro) before getting in to the car.

From Rome to Naples: how to get there

The quickest and most comfortable way to travel from Rome to Naples is by the high speed Frecciarossa train. The journey from Roma Termini to Napoli Centrale-Piazza Garibaldi takes just 1 hour and ten minutes. Tickets cost circa 40.00 Euro and can be purchased online on www.trenitalia.it

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Whilst there are other types of train from Rome to Naples, such as the more economic Intercity and regional trains, these are all decidedly slower.

If you're traveling by car: useful information

From late March to early November, cars with Italian number plates (with the exception of vehicles belonging to residents and those rented at the airport) are not allowed to circulate on the island of Capri.

Cars are of little use on the island, most of which is pedestrianized, and we strongly suggest you leave your car on the mainland, in one of the secure car parks near to the ports.

Car parks near to the port of Sorrento: in Sorrento you'll find a parking area at Marina Piccola, close to the docks. There are numerous other car parks in the town, the most economic of which is the underground Correale car park (behind Piazza Angelina Lauro).

Car parks near to Naples' Molo Beverello: the 100 place Buono car park is located right next to the port. Should this car park be full, you can park in the large Brin car park, located close to the motorway exit. From here you will need to take a bus or taxi to Molo Beverello (circa 4 kilometers away).
